## Take the ʔiisaak Pledge (ii-saak)

The ʔiisaak Pledge invites you to travel with respect, truth, generosity, and care—upholding Tla-o-qui-aht values as you explore this place.

### ʔiisaaksinḥiʔin (ii-saak-sin-hi-in) *Let us be respectful of Natural Law.*

- Recognize how your presence impacts this place—make those impacts positive.
- Keep a safe distance from wildlife and secure all food and belongings.
- Stay prepared for shifting weather and tides.
- Respect plants and animals who share a right to thrive here.

### taaquḥiʔin (taa-quuḥ-thli-in) *Let us speak truthfully and act honorably.*

- Acknowledge that you are on Indigenous lands and conduct yourself as a guest.
- Learn the true history of this place—including the impacts of colonization.
- Use Tla-o-qui-aht place names and support language revitalization.
- Report concerns (fires, wildlife disturbance, dumping) to Tla-o-qui-aht Tribal Parks.

### ḥaayiksinḥiʔin (ḥlaa-yak-siin-hi-in) *Let us be generous and helpful.*

- Join a beach clean-up or habitat restoration.
- Support Tribal Parks Allies businesses.
- Contribute to the Tribal Parks Ecosystem Services Fee to protect this place for generations.

### Qʷaasiinḥapin (Qwaa-siin-hap-in) *Let us leave healthy habitats undisturbed.*

- Leave no trace and clean up after yourself.
- Do not disturb or collect plants, shells, or cultural belongings.
- Walk, camp, and explore only in designated areas.
- Respect seasonal closures and wildlife nesting zones.
